DECEMBER MEETING

Vandalism to Sandyke Road Cars

The Clerk had written to the police seeking advice about installing CCTV cameras to deter this vandal from slashing/puncturing tyres of parked cars overnight. No reply as yet but the Clerk will continue to chase up the matter. (Clerk's note – the police have since offered to address the Council's 2nd January Meeting)

Resignation

Members heard with great sadness a message from David Havard regretting his continuing poor health meant he felt he had to resign. The Council will miss his contributions to debates. The Clerk will advertise the vacancy in the usual way. (Clerk's note – David represented the Broad Haven ward but anyone in the Havens area can apply – please contact the Clerk for full details)

Plans

Cllrs supported plans for two holiday cottages near the Millmoor cottages site, the division of Landhouse, Talbenny into two separate dwellings and a dwelling to replace a redundant shower block at Rosehill Caravan Park. They objected to an application to fence off the grassed area off Puffin Way in

front of 2-6 Beachfields, Broad Haven. This land was designated as a "village green" and Cllrs had received letters of objection from neighbours that fencing it off would have the effect of turning public recreation land into private use.

Parcel of land opposite Millbrook, Little Haven

The Clerk had received a reply from The Land Registry stating that it was "difficult to see upon what basis you may challenge the registration". Members felt that the Havens Community Council did have a basis to challenge the registration as sole guardians of the interests of locals. After discussion the Clerk was instructed to seek advice from the planning advisor retained by the Pembs Association of Local Councils. Members learned that Pembs County Council had consented to the registration in 2004 but it had not consulted The Havens Community Council which would certainly have strongly objected.

Sandyke Road and Millmoor Way Broad Haven

The Clerk will ask for the lines to define parking places to be repainted following the road resurfacing work in Sandyke Road. Also the bus stop layby in Millmoor Way was being used for vehicle parking causing the bus to stop in the middle of the road. He will ask if proper bus stop markings could be painted to discourage parking.

HAVENS ENVIRONMENT GROUP

Anyone with a few hours to spare on Saturday, 13th January might like to join us for the first of the 2007 Beach Cleans. Doubtless there will be those who would like to put in a little extra exercise after some over-indulgence during the Christmas period. Please note that we will now be meeting for the next few months at the Millmoor Car Park. The time remains the same: 10.00 a.m.

The turbulent weather of the past few weeks or so has been bringing in large quantities of netting and some of the larger waste products that litter Britain's beaches. Any amount that can be removed reduces the risks to humans and to wildlife.

We were glad to have Dave Kennard join us once more in November. He was

able to manhandle a large wooden cable reel from the southern end of the beach. We certainly would have found this difficult to deal with. One doesn't have to possess too much of an imagination to realise the serious consequence an item of this size might have for those partaking in the joys of the surf.

Thank you to those folk who take the trouble whilst out walking to remove similar items from the beach and place them where they can be collected by the County Council.

We all love to see dogs and their owners enjoying the beach and the sea, but please, dog owners, do carry a plastic bag with you so that you can clean up after your animals!!

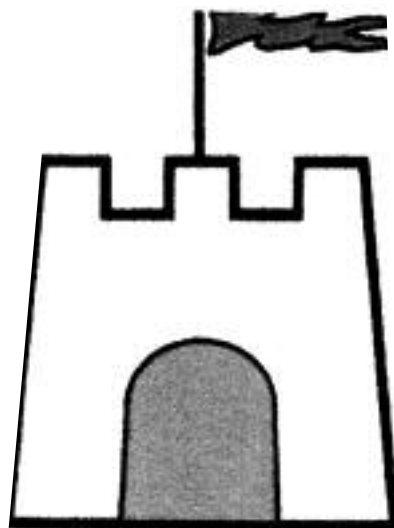

WELSH CORNER

The corner for all things Welsh. Facts, figures, mythology, history recipes and more. This month, 12 things you may not of known about Wales.

1. The capstone of the neolithic burial chamber at Tinkinswood, near Cardiff, is estimated to weigh approximately 40 tonnes, and is the largest in Britain.
2. One of the largest Bronze Age copper mines in Europe was on the Great Orme near present-day Llandudno.
3. Celtic religion, literature, poetry, art and civilisation pre-dates the coming of the Angles, Saxons and other barbarian hordes from mainland Europe, by many centuries.
4. Before the coming of the Saxons the population of England spoke Welsh.
5. The Saxons called all the Britons that they failed to conquer, 'waelas' meaning 'foreigners'. This is where the name 'Wales' originates from.
6. The Welsh name for the English is 'Sais' meaning Saxon.
7. Contrary to Saxon propaganda the Druids were ministers of peace and carried no weapons.
8. The Welsh name for Wales, Cymru (Cum-ree), comes from the word 'Cymro' meaning companion or friend.
9. The name 'Britain' comes from the Romans, the people became known as Britons.
10. The Romans employed 3 Legions to protect themselves from the Welsh and the Scots. Two of the three Legions were needed on the Welsh border.
11. St. David, the patron saint of Wales probably came from Ireland to Wales, whilst St. Patrick, the patron saint of Ireland probably came from Wales to Ireland. St. George, the patron saint of England was probably Turkish, and never came anywhere near England.
12. Llantwit Major in South Glamorgan is the oldest university town in Britain by many centuries.

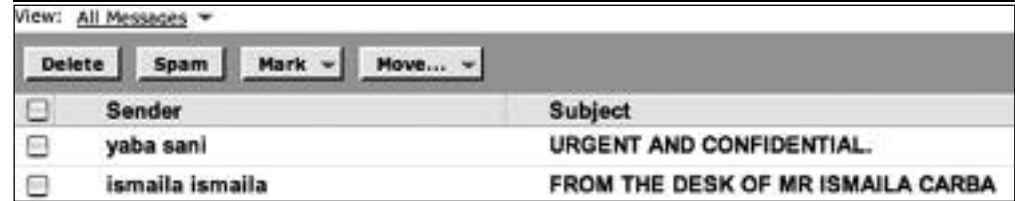

Unfortunately, it has now become overwhelmed with what are called 'Spam' emails, which has made it very difficult to pick out the genuine contributions from the junk. It will still be checked for a little while, but will eventually be discontinued.

The rise of email communication has brought many benefits in the ease and convenience of exchanging messages and pictures, but it also comes with many dangers and pitfalls and has become a new area for criminals to target innocent victims. Follow these little tips to stay safe when emailing:

1. Only open emails from people you know and trust. There may be occasions that people you don't know obtain your email address and send you an innocent message, but a lot of the time emails from strangers can contain things like computer viruses and worms. Look out for strange

names and message titles. If in doubt, don't open the email. Instead click the tick box next to it, and look for a Junk/Spam button on your email account and click that. This will automatically delete it and report the address to your email account provider.

2. NEVER give out personal details to anyone via email. Especially bank account details. Genuine Banks, Building Societies and financial institutions will NEVER ask you to send personal or account details by email. Criminals use bank/building society names as their email identities, and will ask you to 'update' or 'activate' bank accounts by email. Do that, and watch thousands of pounds leave your account!

3. If it sounds to good to be true, it usually is! If you get an email from some weird sounding african name, telling you about the fantastic opportunity to earn thousands of pounds by depositing a large sum of money in your bank account and then forwarding it onto someone else...guess what? Its another con to get your bank details!

4. Keep emailing, but stay safe!
